Year One	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Singing and Percussion</u></p> <p>In music, the children will be exploring pitch and rhythm using their voices and percussion instruments. Children will learn how music can be used to tell a story and will learn the story of Tiddalick the Frog. We will be exploring dynamics, tempo and how to recognise the changes in music. The children will learn songs for the Nativity Play.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>How can you help your child at home?</u></p> <p>Sing with your child. Listen to assorted styles of music at home from Classical, Folk, Pop, Jazz, Musical Theatre, etc</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Singing (Story Telling)</u></p> <p>The children will learn the stories of Tiddalick the Frog, Lakshmi, and Anasi. They will be introduced to traditional stories from the Indigenous Australian, Indian, and African and Caribbean cultures. The children will learn about notating and composing rhythms and pitches using words from within the story. The children will sing in unison and parts and incorporate actions and drama to tell stories with their music. The children will be able to play as a larger ensemble and create their own compositions in small groups. <p>Clubs</p>		<p><u>Choir</u></p> <p>Open to all KS2 children, though children must nominate to be a member and consistent participation is expected. Rehearsals will be held at lunchtime on Friday (12:45-1:15).</p> <p><u>Instrumental Club</u></p> <p>All children in KS1 can participate learning more about specific instruments, such as recorder, ukulele, keyboard, and percussion instruments. The focus of this group will be performance and instrumental skills, but there will still be occasional singing. Rehearsals will be after school from 3:15-4:15 on Friday afternoons.</p>	<p><u>Choir</u></p> <p>Open to all KS2 children, though children must nominate to be a member and consistent participation is expected. Rehearsals will be held at lunchtime on Friday (12:45-1:15).</p> <p><u>Instrumental Club</u></p> <p>All children in KS1 can participate learning more about specific instruments, such as recorder, ukulele, keyboard, and percussion instruments. The focus of this group will be performance and instrumental skills, but there will still be occasional singing. Rehearsals will be after school from 3:15-4:15 on Friday afternoons.</p>
